The Denmark Environment Centre aims to educate residents and visitors about Denmark's unique natural environment, how we can conserve it and how we can reduce the impact we make. What Do We Do?

The Denmark Environment Centre offers a central location in Denmark that community members can visit to express concerns about environmental issues and access environmental resources and information. Members of the Centre are able to borrow books from the Centre's library and use the community computer, microscope and herbarium.

The Centre also coordinates a range of education and research projects supporting conservation of the environment surrounding Denmark. These have included land care and revegetation projects, fungi and wildlife surveys, education activities, research projects, installation of educational signage and more. Members are supported in preparing submissions addressing environmental issues and the Centre advocates for local environmental action on issues.
